# CURRICULUM VITAE

Maria Thrän (they/them) is a Berlin- and Seattle-based interdisciplinary artist, performer, and Ph.D. researcher in the University of Washington's DXARTS program. Their immersive kinetic installations and performances weave mechatronics, and spatial sound synthesis, light, and video to explore rhythm, embodied memory, and more-than-human communication. By transforming exhibition spaces into responsive perceptual systems, Maria prompts audiences to reflect on their ecological entanglements—and to consider how bodies, voices, and technologies can become tools of protest and resistance.

Their research-driven practice probes ecological entanglement, technological agency, and the poetics of signal and noise through speculative modes of preservation. Maria's work has been shown internationally in solo and group exhibitions—including Milan, Minsk, Prague, Berlin, and Frankfurt—and through residencies around the globe
